DORCHESTER'S 350TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION: Reenactments spotlighting Dorchester heritage, historical displays, and the opening of a 50-year-old time capsule. Celebration is from noon to 5pm. Program begins at 2pm with highlights including a visit by Lt. Gov Boyd Rutherford, music, cutting of the anniversary cake and the opening of the time capsule that was sealed on the county's 300th anniversary in 1969. This event will be centered in a "heritage village" at the Courthouse, 206 High St.
